WHEN AND WHERE TO FIND US

Renens

ECAL is located in Renens, in the heart of the Lausanne urban area. With a population of over 20,000 people, Renens is the capital of the Ouest Lausannois district and is one of the largest towns in the canton of Vaud.

There is an extensive and well-developed public transport system, so residents and commuters can easily get around. It also has excellent train links, making it easy to travel to and from Switzerland's major cities. It takes 2.5 hours by train to Zurich or Basel, 1 hour to Bern and just 40 minutes to Geneva.

Renens was an agricultural village until the end of the 19th century. It then transformed into a true industrial town, with the help of a railway. However, at the end of the 20th century, the industrial sector was overtaken by the service sector. Hence why, under the impetus of former director Pierre Keller, ECAL is located in a former Iril tights factory that was renovated in 2007 by architect Bernard Tschumi.

Our building

The ECAL building is close to 19,000m² in size. In addition to classrooms and open-plan study areas, it contains three large lecture halls, a film studio, a recording and mixing studio, a photography studio, a model workshop, an exhibition gallery (elac), a specialized library, a materials library, a printing center with printers and lithography, screen printing and engraving workshops, and a technology center.

Also in the building, but not belonging to ECAL itself, is the 2,000m² EPFL+ECAL lab. This is a teaching and research unit run by EPFL (Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne), with whom ECAL collaborates regularly.

Opening hours

We are open Monday to Friday from 7 am to 9 pm. We are closed on weekends, public holidays and during the university holidays. You must have a student card to access the university building.

ADMINISTRATION

Academic calendar

You can download the academic calendar from the ECAL website under *Studies > Academic calendar/Holidays*. It includes the term dates, university holidays and public holidays.

Student card

At the beginning of the academic year, all new students receive their student ID card, which also serves as an electronic wallet.

Good to know: Your student card gives you access to the ECAL building and can be used to pay for printing and photocopies, as well as to buy items from the supplies store and the cafeteria. The card also provides some benefits outside of the university, such as for cultural or sporting activities.

The card is reregistered each year, and you can top it up at the charger located in the library or by credit card and TWINT via the ECAL Campus app. However, no card can be issued or reregistered until your fees have been paid and your administrative formalities for the current academic year have been completed. Please note: If your card is lost, stolen or damaged, you will be charged **CHF 50** to replace it.

Certificate of enrolment

All students also receive a certificate of enrolment that is valid from 1 September to 31 August (30 June for graduating students). A digital copy of the certificate is stored on the Intranet, under *My documents* on your personal profile. If necessary, an original document can be issued by the Administration department.

AHES Form

All new students (except Foundation Year and MAS DLC students) are asked to carefully complete the AHES questionnaire, which can be found at the following web page: https://age.hes-so.ch/imoniteur_AGEP/!formInscrs.connection?ww_i_forminscr=5071197225&ww_c_langue=en Use your AAI username and password to log in.

The questionnaire, along with its attachments, must be completed online no later than one week before the start of the academic year. Without this document, we cannot complete the registration process. If you have any questions, please contact the Administration department, and they will be pleased to help.

INSURANCE

Personal Liability Insurance

If you wish to borrow ECAL equipment, you must have personal third-party liability insurance cover.

You must give your certificate of insurance to the Administration department. Please note: any lost, damaged or stolen equipment is charged at its current purchase price, apart from exceptional cases authorized in advance by members of senior management for the purchase of duly serviced used equipment.

Health Insurance

Everybody who lives in Switzerland must take out health insurance with an organization that is recognized by the State.

Good to know: Foreign students may be exempt from this requirement, provided they have equivalent insurance coverage. EU nationals need to apply for a European Health Insurance Card from their health insurance body. Non-EU nationals complete the "Check form for the equivalent of Swiss health insurance" and have it signed by their insurer (the form is available here: https://www.vd.ch/themes/sante-soins-et-handicap/assurance-maladie/obligation-dassurance/).

If you are not eligible for any exemption, please take the necessary steps to register with a Swiss health insurance policy as soon as possible.

IT

Computer accounts

All students have two IT accounts:

- one ECAL account that gives you access to the services and applications provided by the IT Service
- an AAI account that gives you access to certain services shared by Swiss universities

The username is the same for both accounts (first name.last name). However, the passwords are different. You can change your ECAL password at any time at the following address: https://account.activedirectory.windowsazure.com/Change-Password.aspx. You must change your AAI password every six months. You will receive an automated email prompting you to do so.

You will be sent instructions about how to activate your accounts by email during the summer

Personal computers

A personal computer is essential for students on a BA, MA or MAS program.

ACCOMMODATION AND LOCKERS

Accommodation

We do not have our own accommodation to offer, but may, as far as possible, guide you in looking for accommodation. Since it can be difficult to find accommodation in the Lake Geneva area, we advise you to start looking well in advance.

Personal Locker

If you are a Foundation Year student, you are automatically allocated a personal locker. The locker number is sent to you before the start of term.

If you are a BA, MA or MAS student, and you need a locker, you can submit a request to the Administration department. Lockers are allocated according to availability on a first come, first served basis. Since we do not have enough lockers for all students, we advise you to consider sharing.

In order to avoid theft, every student with a locker should use a padlock. If you lose the key or code to your padlock, it will be cut open. Lockers must be emptied when students leave the university permanently and at the end of each academic year.

FINANCE

Tuition fees

The tuition fees are available on the ECAL website, under Studies > Fee Foundation Year / Fee Bachelor – Master – MAS. With the exception of MAS DLC, fees are paid in a single payment before the start of the academic year, on the basis of information provided by the ECAL Finance department.

Please note: You cannot attend classes if you have not paid your fees in advance. Failure to pay following two reminders will result in exmatriculation.

If you leave ECAL during the autumn semester, the tuition fees and any contributions towards educational costs for the spring semester will be refunded upon written request.

We do not grant family discounts.

Budgeting

In addition to fees, there are further costs, both directly and indirectly related to studies, which you should take into account when drawing up an annual budget. The FAQ page on our website – *Studies* > *FAQ – Useful information – provides* an indicative minimum budget for a year of studies that covers fees, accommodation, food, transport, insurance, etc.

DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

ADMINISTRATION

Secretariat

The Secretariat is open from Monday to Friday, in the morning from 8 am to 12 pm and in the afternoon from 1.30 pm to 5 pm, except on Fridays, when it closes at 4 pm (subject to change).

You must inform the Secretariat as soon as possible if you take a break or withdraw completely from your studies, if you wish to submit a leave application, or if you change your address or contact number. Depending on the circumstances, you may be required to provide supporting documents.

The Secretariat also provides support on issues related to Swiss military service, civil service and civil protection. All requests, which must be accompanied by the relevant documentation, are processed as soon as possible. Late requests will not be processed, except in special cases.

COURSES

Important documents

Some of our BA programs, as well as our MA Design program, offer students the opportunity to do an internship for credit. For BA programs, the internship takes place during the second year and is worth 30 ECTS credits. For the MA Design program, the internship takes place in between the first and second year and is worth 15 ECTS credits. For information about the procedures and steps to be taken, please contact the person in charge of the subject or discipline concerned.

It is also possible to carry out an internship – for which no credits are awarded – during the summer holidays. We can provide Internship Agreements. For more information, please contact the Administration department.

SERVICES AND WORKSHOPS

(Only to be used by ECAL staff and students)

Prototype workshop

The Prototype workshop is primarily intended for students from the BA Industrial Design, MA Product Design and MAS Design for Luxury and Craftmanship programs. To access the workshop, students must complete a refresher course and have it validated by the workshop manager. Students from other departments may also access the workshop upon request and provided they complete the course mentioned above.

The Prototype workshop is a machine workshop, with two areas dedicated to computer-assisted manufacturing (CAM), a textile room, a laboratory, a painting shop and assembly rooms. These areas contain traditional joinery machines, mechanical machines, locksmith and plastics-processing machines, digital and laser-cutting machines, as well as 3D printers and sewing machines. This equipment enables students to make scale models, prototypes or do any other work.

The workshop can only function smoothly if users behave appropriately. Therefore, a set of guidelines has been drawn up that outlines the rights and duties of all users. The document is given to the relevant students at the start of the academic year. The guidelines are also available on the Intranet: https://intranet.ecal.ch/fr/101/Informations-generales

The library is open non-stop from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm. It has nearly 22,000 publications and DVDs, and 80 specialist journals about art and design.

Good to know: You cannot borrow the publications, but you can look at them and scan and/or photocopy them on site.

You will be given instructions about how to use the library at the start of the academic year, and you can also find a lot of useful information on the Intranet: https://intranet.ecal.ch/fr/107/Informations-generales?reason=ok
The library manager also provides specialized information upon request.

The materials library is located in the same area as the main library. The person in charge is regularly present and has a schedule that can be found on the Intranet: https://intranet.ecal.ch/fr/1278/Informations-generales

The materials library has a wide range of materials, samples, industrial processes, as well as a technical library of manuals from service providers and suppliers that are useful for any project.

Please note: You cannot borrow the materials, and they must remain on site.

The supplies store is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from **9.30 am to 11 am**. These opening hours may differ during workshop weeks, exam periods, remediation or graduations). You can find the schedule for the supplies store on the Intranet: https://intranet.ecal.ch/fr/1278/Informations-generales

Orders can only be made using the ECAL Campus app. Once you have completed your order, you can then select a time slot for when you wish to collect it.

Library

Materials library

Supplies store

The supplies store sells different types of paper, as well as small materials, such as textiles, models, photos, etc. You can find the price lists on the Intranet:

If you wish to order paper that is not sold by the supplies store, you need to do this via other means than through ECAL. Invoicing or delivery in the name of ECAL is not authorized.

Good to know: All purchases are made with your student card, which you can top up at the library or on the ECAL Campus app. Orders cannot be made for ordinary materials that are available in external stores.

ECAL's printing center is open to BA, MA, and MAS students. Foundation Year students only have access to it during exam periods.

A wide variety of digital and offset printing can be done at the printing center. It also has spaces dedicated to screen printing, lithography and engraving. Detailed information about printing and binding techniques is available on the Intranet: https://intranet.ecal.ch/fr/151/Centre-d-impression

You can start using the printers once all your administrative formalities for the start of the academic year have been completed and your tuition fees have been paid. You must install and activate PaperCut client software to be able to print from an ECAL workstation or your personal computer. Any printing on special paper needs to be done at the printing center.

Good to know: We give students CHF 100.- for printing each semester and CHF 200 to graduating students. This allocation may be carried forward from one semester to the next, but not from one year to the next or from one student to another.

Please note: Printing errors are only reimbursed for large quantities and if there is a valid reason.

Technology center

We have recently built a technology center that brings together expertise such as artificial intelligence, augmented reality, virtual reality, use of medical sensors, motion tracking, photogrammetry, access to the platforms of the main suppliers of smartphones and tablets, home automation, robotics, video mapping, etc. Access is granted on request.

Audiovisual department

Our audiovisual department provides state-of-the-art equipment, particularly in the fields of visual communication (photography, media & interaction design, graphic design) and cinema.

ou can borrow this equipment for a specified period of time by reserving on the Intranet: https://reservations.ecal.ch/cire/SignIn.aspx, and you must also provide a personal third-party liability insurance certificate. In certain circumstances, you may need to be trained by a supervisory staff member before borrowing specialist equipment.

Intendancy

The Intendancy has two full-time staff members, one of whom lives on the ECAL premises. They supervise and participate in the maintenance of the university, and they ensure everything in the building operates correctly.

Service Desk

The service desk is the main point of contact between the IT department and users. Email service

The email address in *first name.last name@ecal.ch* format is accessible internally or externally by webmail at *https://webmail.ecal.ch/webmail/login/* or via the email software. The mailbox has a storage capacity of 1 GB. An automatic reminder will be sent when the mailbox is 95% full. It is not possible to redirect these emails to a private email address. Please note: Only ECAL staff may send group emails in order

to communicate official information. However, there is an advertising service on the Intranet that you can use to post different types of messages.

Personal directory

Every student has an "Acronis My Home" personal directory that is stored on an ECAL server. It is automatically saved each weekend. You can connect to your directory using the "Acronis File Connect" app or by visiting https://myhome.ecal.ch

The storage capacity is 15 GB. Your personal directory is stored throughout the duration of your studies at ECAL and is deleted once you have completed your studies.

Wi-Fi

The ECALNET network is reserved for ECAL staff members and students. To connect to the network, use the username ECAL (same username for the wired network). Guests should use the ECAL-PUBLIC network. This can be used by staff and students if there is a problem with ECALNET, for example, if it is not possible to connect.

Security and backup

Data from a physically damaged hard drive cannot be recovered. We therefore advise you to never store all of your files in just one place and to back up your files more often, particularly during the exam periods. There are several places for you to store your files: your ECAL personal directory (up to 10 GB), your personal computer, USB sticks, external hard drives, and the Cloud (iCloud Drive, Adobe Creative Cloud). However, beware of privacy issues when transferring files to the Cloud.

EXHIBITIONS

elac gallery

The elac (espace lausannois d'art contemporain) gallery adjoins the ECAL building, and it is one of the biggest galleries in Europe that is attached to a university. It is open to the public, and it displays the work of established artists and designers, as well as works by students. CAFETERIA

ELDORA-ECAL Restaurant

The ELDORA-ECAL restaurant is open Monday to Friday from **7.45 am to 3.45 pm**. It offers a varied menu every lunchtime, as well as a salad buffet, a pasta buffet, hot and cold drinks, sandwiches, and other snacks.

There is a coffee machine, a drinks dispenser and a water cooler that are available to use both during and outside the restaurant's opening hours, so you can refuel at any time.

The glasses and cutlery, as well as the condiments, are only available to restaurant customers. Food and beverages may only be consumed at the restaurant and not in the class-rooms or workshops.

Microwaves and sorting bins

Microwaves are available in the cafeteria. Please note: You must use a closed container, so that the inside of the microwave does not get dirty. We also kindly ask that you use the sorting bins and help to keep the cafeteria area clean and welcoming.

MISCELLANEOUS

Mobility

We encourage our staff members and students to use public transport and to choose sustainable methods of travel. The university is easily accessible thanks to a well-developed public transport network. More information is available on the SBB and TL websites, and the ECAL Campus app.

The university also has a two-storey bicycle rack located at the front of the building. The ECAL car park is reserved for staff and visitors. It has two charging stations for electric cars. Students who have no other choice but to drive to ECAL should use street parking around the university or a car park in Renens.

Drinking alcohol and smoking

It is strictly forbidden to consume alcohol on the university premises, both inside and outside the building, unless senior management have given authorization. Smoking is also prohibited, except in the university's internal courtyard.

Please respect one another and place cigarette butts and other trash in the ashtrays and bins provided.

Doors and elevators

You may not use the elevators or service lifts unless you have a valid health reason that has been authorized by the Administration department, or if you are carrying heavy equipment.

Please note: For security reasons, the external doors are locked and can only be opened with a student card. It is therefore forbidden to hold external doors or windows open in any way.

Lausanne's museums offer a wide variety of exhibitions, from classical and historical to innovative and contemporary. Below is a list of just some of the ones on offer:

The Cantonal Museum of Fine Arts (French: Musée cantonal des Beaux-Arts, MCBA), which is home to the Toms Pauli and Félix Vallotton foundations, the Musée de l'Elysée (Cantonal Museum of Photography), and mudac (Museum of Contemporary Design and Applied Arts). The Cantonal Museum of Fine Arts is built on the site of a former train depot at the Lausanne train station. https://plateforme10.ch/fr

Cinémathèque suisse is one of the most important film archives in the world. There are a lot of public screenings, many of which are attended by directors, actors and film professionals. www.cinematheque.ch/f/

The Cantonal Museum of Archaeology and History (French: Musée cantonal d'archéologie et d'histoire). Located in the Palais de Rumine in the center of Lausanne, this museum allows visitors to discover over 15,000 years' worth of history about the canton of Vaud. www.mcah.ch/accueil/

The Hermitage Foundation (French: La Fondation de L'Hermitage). This museum is located in a magnificent 19th century house in the upper part of the city. It hosts temporary exhibitions dedicated to fine arts. www.fondation-hermitage.ch/actualite/

The Pully Museum of Art (French: Musée d'art de Pully) exhibits contemporary art, historical art from the 19th and 20th centuries, and collaborations with art institutions in the region. www.museedartdepully.ch/fr/accueil/

Independent art exhibitions

Independent art exhibitions are also very dynamic and often display works from artists and designers who previously studied at ECAL. For example, les Ateliers de Bellevaux (www.ateliersbellevaux.ch/residents/), Le Cabanon (lecabanon-unil.ch), Circuit (www.circuit.li), Forma (www.forma-art.ch), Locus solus (https://locus-solus.ch/artiste/), La Placette (www.laplacette.ch/?page_id=2), Tunnel Tunnel (www.tunneltunnel.ch), Silicon Malley (https://siliconmalley.ch), Standard/Deluxe (www.standard-deluxe.ch).

Cafés

For an aperitif in the sun in a beautiful medieval garden in the heart of the city, go to Bar Giraf at Le Vieux-Lausanne. Not far away, cozy restaurant Evêché serves fondues and other Swiss specialties. A little further north, you can sit down at La Couronne d'Or, one of the oldest cafés in Lausanne, or you can get a craft beer at Brasserie du Château. Towards the south of the city, in Saint-François square, you will find Café Romand. Famous for its Vaudois specialties, this café is one of the most popular places around. Café Saint Pierre is an urban, stylish restaurant where you can enjoy brunch during weekend.

But perhaps you would prefer Folie Voltaire in the Mon-Repos park or the vintage style of Bar Tabac. Or there's Les Grandes Roches, with its unusual terrace, L'A-T-E-L-I-E-R, a small neighborhood café, or Café de Grancy in the Sous-Gare area, which has comfy sofas that are perfect for chilling out.

On top of all that, right next to ECAL, you have Fermes des Tilleuls, where they serve homemade sirup and iced tea. Also close by is G.R.A.M, a restaurant and urban market that sells local and seasonal products.

Bars and clubs

Lausanne has an abundance of bars, clubs, exclusive lounges, concert halls and other music venues that could rival the biggest European cities. You can find electronic, jazz, rock. and Latino music, and festivals. If you enjoy a party atmosphere, there is such a diversity of entertainment venues in the area that you can keep the party going until the early hours of the morning. You can take your pick between a range of great places, such as Le Bourg, a former cinema that has been converted into a café-theatre. It offers an eclectic program of concerts, and techno and electronic DJ sets at weekends and during the week. There's also Buzz, a lively bar offering themed nights and live concerts, as well as Club ABC and D! On top of that, Club is also a former cinema and is open from Wednesday to Sunday from 5 pm onwards. Folklor plays techno music and has Berlin club vibes, and Le Romandie is a hall located under Lausanne's Grand Pont where you can discover many different musical styles.





MAP OF ECAL (AND FIRST AID KIT)








